### LOOK OUT FOR SCAMS

Every year, especially around the holidays, scam artists are on the hunt. Financial scams are among the most common crimes affecting U.S. adults and families. It is estimated that in 2023, 15% of all households had at least one member fall prey to some form of fraud or scam.

Last year, Americans lost about \$8billion with the average scammed person losing \$650. There is some good news! That number is going down year by year. People are catching on to scams faster and sharing scam information then ever before.

Many people think scams mostly affect older adults. But recent reports tell a different story: anyone can and is being targeted.

Many younger adults are falling prey to scams like thru fake online businesses. These scams target people thru social media and luring them into false online purchases.

Older Americans fell for scams less, but unfortunately those who did lost the most money. Older adults are mostly were victim's of "imposter" scams: false tech support, fake business, hoax lottery and copied friend/family accounts.

The lesson is clear: no matter your age, learning about scams is important for everyone. By sharing what you know, you can help protect others in your community from scams.

The best advice for avoiding fraud to be skeptical:

- Double check and verify sales, deals and websites.
- Consult with others to confirm brands and deals online.
- Stick to trusted and verifiable websites.
- Confirm account details independently.
- Never share personal information without confirmation.
- Always keep an eye on your accounts for suspicious activity.
- When you suspect a scam report it!

#### VISHING/SMISHING -

Scammer will call or text, claiming to be from Amazon Customer Service. They tell you there is an issue with your order, account or possibly even that you that you are in need of a refund. To process or correct they need you to confirm personal information or verify payment methods.

RECENT SCAMS -AMAZON HAOX

#### FAKE INVOICE -

Scammer will text or email a fake order confirmation message informing you of a recent Amazon purchase. This fake confirmation may even include product specifics like UPC information, price, company logos. It will direct you to a link you can follow to undo the purchase. If you end up clicking the link, you may accidentally infect your device with malware or end up on a spoofed site.

#### REMEMBER

- Amazon rarely makes direct calls to customers.
- Amazon will **never** ask you to disclose or verify sensitive personal information.
- No matter how convincing the person may be, avoid responding or engaging with the message at all.
- When in doubt: review your account on Amazon.com to see if any issues need to be addressed.

If you received suspicious communication pretending to be from Amazon report it at <u>stop-spoofing@amazon.com</u> and <u>reportfraud.ftc.gov</u>

#### RECENT SCAMS - SOCIAL MEDIA PURCHASING

With this new scam, an advertisement will pop up on social media websites. Usually small, unknown online business. The website offers amazing, unbelievable sales and deals. The purchase transaction will go thru. You get a receipt and possibly even a fake tracking number but the product never arrives.

#### REMEMBER

- Look for external reviews to see if a website has scammed anyone in the past.
- Pay special attention to addresses that end in .net or .org, as these types of domain names are far less common for online shopping sites.
- When you purchase online, look for the the padlock symbol that signifies you're logged into a secure connection.

#### **OUR STATIONS:**

AARP Foundation Tax-Aide - Volunteers assist seniors filing taxes. Program runs January - April 15th.

Amateur Radio Service (ARES®) - Volunteers help coordinate emergency communication exercises as licensed "ham" radio operators withing Racine & Kenosha.

Ascension All Saints Healthcare - Volunteers serve as Comfort Care Visitors and Gift Shop Assistants. If you have a registered support animal they may also serve with the Pet Therapy team.

Aurora Medical Center - Volunteers help either in clerical/admin as Main Entrance or Inpatient Floor Assistant OR in companion care visiting and comforting patients.

beLEAF, SURVIVORS, Inc. - Volunteers here serve as a trained Advocates, answering calls on a crisis line. Training is provided quarterly. Help is urgently needed.

Caledonia Historical Society - Volunteers lend their talents to preserving and teaching local history .

EZ-ID - Technical Assistant volunteers help to assemble Senior and Children missing-person recovery kits.

Habitat for Humanity - Volunteers with this group assist their local community in one of three main roles: Construction Worker, Habitat ReStore sales or General Admin/Clerk.

Meals on Wheels (ADRC) - Volunteers deliver meals to homebound seniors or help at local dining areas.

**MyRIDE Senior Transportation** - Volunteers provide free transportation within Racine County to seniors for medical appts, grocery stores, pharmacies, hair salons, etc.

Racine Heritage Museum - Volunteers help at the reception and sales shop, as a Heritage Walking Tour guide or within the archiving and researching department.

Riverbend Nature Center - Volunteers put their love of the outdoors into action as a Habitat Healer and Volunteer Naturalist

**Senior Companion Program** - Volunteers provide companionship to local homebound seniors thru regular social visits, phone calls, letters and/or emails. Volunteers are carefully paired to ensure matching interests and compatibility. This program is rapidly growing and in need of volunteers.

Sew n' Save - Volunteers here put their crafting skills to use sewing for great causes.

Siena Retreat Center - Volunteers here serve as Outreach Assistants - helping with the admin desk and library, as well as assisting during special events. This program is in urgent need of a volunteer to assist on Wednesdays.

**St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry** - Volunteers with this group help keep the pantry running by stocking shelves, packaging groceries and assisting pantry clients.

#### Ingredients


- 4 tablespoons butter
- ¾ cup all-purpose flour
- ¾ cup sugar
- I teaspoon baking powder
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ¾ cup milk
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 2 cups of sliced fresh fruit OR 12-ounce package of frozen fruit

#### **EASY BAKED FRUIT COBBLER**

#### Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Adjust the oven rack to the upper-middle position.
- 2.Put butter in an 8-inch square or 9-inch round pan; place in the oven until butter is melted. Remove the pan from the oven and set aside.
- 3. Whisk flour, 3/4 cup sugar, baking powder, and salt in a medium bowl. Whisk in milk until a smooth batter forms.
- 4. Pour batter into the prepared pan with melted butter.
- 5. Scatter fruit over batter. Sprinkle with 1 tablespoon sugar.
- 6. Bake in the preheated oven until the top is lightly browned and fruit bubbles, 50 to 60 minutes.
- 7.Serve warm or at room temperature.
